A Note from the Hopewell Township Manager

The Transition

The year 2014 brought some major changes to our Board of Commissioners and management staff for the township, which has led us to where we are in 2015. Our Manager/Controller Andy Brunette passed away suddenly in March of 2014, and the Board of Commissioners asked me to step in as the new Township Manager. I had previously served on the Board of Commissioners for 11 years, the last two years as President. I officially assumed the Manager's role on April 7, 2014. The Board then chose former Chief of Police Gary Tranelli to take my seat on the Board of Commissioners. In October of 2014 the BOC voted to make Marie Hartman the Assistant Manager for Hopewell Township, associated with her ongoing duties as Township Engineer.

The Goals

With those changes now in place, it has become the theme for 2015 to keep the township moving in a more cost-efficient

operating manner, as well as seeking more corporate development to come into the township in 2015 and beyond. The Board of Commissioners has been challenged to maintain a high level of quality service for the residents of the township, while still maintaining a steady tax rate and not raising taxes. The marketing and development effort has worked, as is discussed in Pages 10 & 11 of this newsletter. Our Police, Road and Sewer Departments were equipped with new vehicles and necessary equipment for them to provide the highest level of maintaining your safety and allow them the best opportunity to execute their job requirements and operating more cost efficiently.

The Statistics

Due to the efforts of the Board of Commissioners, the Township Management team and Township employees, we were able to maintain sewer rates as well as maintain the Township real estate tax rate

at the current level of 14 mils. That is an accomplishment we are all proud of, considering we are a First Class Township of approximately 12,600 people encompassing an area of 17.2 square miles. Let us not forget the township encompasses 75 miles of local roads, 50 miles of state roads, as well as 297 streets and 5,350 residential homes and business establishments.

The Future

The Administration's goal for 2015 is to continue pursuing more cost-cutting measures in both the General and Sewer Funds to further ensure the Township is operating as efficiently as possible. We will work to use our Township assets and personnel wisely and consider current technology opportunities and upgrades that will help us to cut unnecessary spending. The Board of Commissioners and Management team for the Township will continue to broaden our relationships with local, state and federal



HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP

As a Valued Customer of Waste Management you Enjoy Single-Stream Recycling. All of your recyclables can be placed together in the same bin! No sorting required!

- REGULAR CURBSIDE COLLECTION:** Garbage and refuse should be placed at the curb the night before your scheduled pick-up.
- GUIDELINES FOR COLLECTION:**
 - Garbage should be in properly secured containers or plastic bags.
 - All furniture items, appliances, household goods and disassembled children's swing sets will be accepted at curbside.
 - Carpet should be rolled and tied in lengths not to exceed 48 inches so that one man can lift.
 - Empty paint cans and/or dried paint is acceptable. Paint can be dried by air drying or soaking up with newspaper or kitty litter. Lids should be left off.
- EXCLUDED ITEMS:**
 - Building material may be picked up for a fee by calling **Waste Management at 1-800-866-4460**
 - Tires
 - Automobile parts including wheel rims.
 - Trees and branches.
 - Ashes from furnaces and fireplaces.
 - Stones and dirt, liquid paint.
- RECYCLING:** Recyclables should be placed loose in a single container.
SINGLE STREAM RECYCLE: Residents do not have to separate the plastics - type I through 7, metals, glass and papers.
ACCEPTABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:
 - Metal:** Metal food cans, aerosol cans (empty), aluminum foil and foil products (clean), beer and soft drink cans
 - Plastic:** Plastic baby wipe containers, bleach, detergent, household cleaner bottles, yogurt cups,

Food containers, margarine tubs, shampoo bottles

- Glass:** Beverage bottles and food jars (clear, brown, amber and green)
- Paper:** Paperboard boxes (cereal, tissue, shoes, etc.), white office paper, computer paper, magazines, newspapers, advertising inserts, junk mail (including envelopes), catalogs, phone books, paperback books, coupons and receipts, paper bags and shopping bags (handles removed), corrugated,

note: corrugated must be tied or bundled and no fin longer than 14" x 14".

Recyclables will be picked up every other week on your regular garbage pick-up day. The municipality will be divided into two sections, ■ and ■. Please refer to the street listing (on reverse) to be sure when service will be provided and refer to the calendar below.

- HOLIDAY SERVICE:** if a holiday falls on a Monday through Friday, pickup for the rest of the week will be one day later than the usual day. Observed holidays for 2015 are: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. If the holiday should fall on a weekend, your pick up day will not be affected.
- APPLIANCES CONTAINING REFRIGERANT:** The contractor will collect such items as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, water coolers, etc.: however, the item must have a sticker certifying that the refrigerant has been removed. If it does not have the sticker, it will not be picked up because it is unlawful for the contractor to dispose of these items containing refrigerant. To save

refrigerant removal costs, it is suggested that residents have the company delivering the new appliance dispose of the old appliance.







HOPEWELL COMMUNITY PARK-RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Park hours are 8:00am to 10:00pm - Winter 8:00am until dusk
2. No bench or table is to be changed or removed without township approval.
3. Do not deface, injure, remove, cut or damage any of the trees, plants, shrubs, turf, buildings or fixtures.
4. Do not annoy others in the park.
5. No persons or group totaling 10 or more can gather in a park pavilion without a Township permit.
6. Use of shelters by permit only. Each permit requires a deposit and rental fee.
7. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES are RESTRICTED. Alcohol may be consumed if the following condition is met: more food than alcohol is present. Consumption of alcohol by underage persons is illegal and strictly prohibited.
8. The exclusive use of alcohol is not permitted in the park.
9. Do not set up a booth, table or stand for the sale of any articles without written Township consent.
10. No dumping of garbage, waste or litter in the park.
11. Do not deface any posted notice or regulation.
12. Do not place any notice or placard without Township approval.
13. No open fires permitted. Fires only made in stoves or special fireplaces provided. Charcoal or wood fires only. Do not use park wood.
14. No discharging of firearms, archery or any other propelled devices in the park.
15. No hunting or trapping on park property.
16. No unlicensed vehicle, all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle or dirt bike in the park.
17. Do not bring pets into the park.
18. No swimming, skating or boating in or on the park lake, unless approved by the Township.
19. No sledding in the park.
20. Do not exceed the 5 mph park speed limit. Do not park in the grass or along the park road areas.
21. Do not climb, sit, stand or walk on any tree, sign, building or other park structures.
22. No tents, shacks, shelters, trailers or other overnight camping structures permitted unless approved by the Township.
23. No hobby devices in the park unless approved by the Township.
24. No "live bait" fishing.
25. No inflatable, playground apparatus, live animals or petting zoo will be permitted without prior approval of the Township management.

VIOLATIONS: of any of the above rules and regulations shall result, upon conviction, of a fine up to \$300.00 and costs of prosecution for each and every offense. **NOTICE:** Please call the Hopewell Township Police Department or the Park Caretaker if you see any violation. Your help and concern will make our Community Park a better place to visit and enjoy.

PERMIT INFORMATION: All permits required by this ordinance must be posted at specific confines at the park. For a permit or information call the Hopewell Township Municipal Building at 724-378-1460 between the hours of 8:00am to 4:30pm, Monday thru Friday.

Pavilion Rental Information

Pavilions are available for rental beginning in mid-February of each year. Reservations must be made at the Municipal Building, 1700 Clark Blvd, Aliquippa, PA. RESERVATIONS CANNOT BE MADE OVER THE PHONE. Payment must be in the form of two checks, one for the rental fee and the other for the deposit, which is \$50 for all rentals. The deposit check will be returned to you after your event, provided the pavilion area is left in good condition and all equipment (volleyball, horseshoes, etc.), is returned.
