ORDINANCE NO. 56-13

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MANUFACTURERS LIGHT AND HEAT COMPANY OF PENNSYLVANIA, TO LAY AND INSTALL A SIXTEEN-INCH GAS TRANSMISSION LINE ALONG, UNDER, THROUGH AND ACROSS PARK AVENUE AND ROOSEVELT AVENUE IN HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA; PRESCRIBING THE LOCATION AND MANNER OF PLACING SAME; REGULATING THE INSPECTION; PRESCRIBING SAFETY STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS AND PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS TO PARK AVENUE AND ROOSEVELT AVENUE.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

SECTION 1. That permission be and is hereby granted to The Manufacturers Light and Heat Company, a Pennsylvania corporation, to lay and install 1,894 feet of sixteen-inch gas transmission line along, under, through and across Park Avenue and Roosevelt Avenue in Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, PROVIDED:

SECTION 2. That said Company, in the installation and maintenance of its underground transmission line, shall not open or encumber more of said streets than will be necessary to enable it to perform the work expeditiously and efficiently and with the minimum of inconvenience to the residents and users of said streets.

SECTION 3. That the said street openings shall be subject to the supervision of the Chairman of the Township Highway Committee and the Township Engineer and said Company shall replace and properly relay that portion of any street pavement, driveway, sidewalk or drainage facility which may have been displaced or damaged by it in the construction and maintenance of its gas transmission line.

SECTION 4. That the said Company shall install and maintain all gas transmission lines and other apparatus installed or constructed under the provisions of this ordinance in good and safe order and condition and shall at all times fully indemnify, protect and save harmless the said Township from and against all actions, claims, suits, damages and charges and against all loss, and necessary expenditures arising from the installation, construction and maintenance of its system, or from its neglect or failure to maintain said transmission system in good and safe order and condition.

SECTION 5. That nothing in this ordinance contained shall be construed to grant unto the said Company any exclusive right, or to prevent a grant of similar privileges to other companies, nor to conflict with the powers and jurisdiction now or hereafter vested by law in the Pennsylvania Department of Highways or its successors over certain highways or with any rules and regulations issued from time to time by the said Department or its successors, governing the use of such highways by public service corporations.

SECTION 6. That the said transmission line shall be laid generally in accordance with Drawing H-8/6 attached to said Company's application of November 20, 1956 on file at the Township Secretary's office; except that said line shall be laid at a minimum distance of ~~seventeen~~ (17) feet from the property lines abutting said streets.

SECTION 7. That said transmission line shall be installed and constructed in accordance with the procedures and standards laid down in the American Standard Code for Pressure Piping and according to the further plans and specifications set out in said Company's application of November 20, 1956.

SECTION 8. That all installation, laying, connecting, welding and wrapping shall be done under the inspection and examination of the Pittsburgh Testing Laboratory or other available and qualified testing laboratory named by the Township Board of Commissioners in their behalf and at the expense of said Company.

SECTION 9. That before beginning work on aforesaid installation the said Company shall deposit with the Hopewell Township Board of Commissioners the sum of Fifty-Five Hundred (\$5500.00) Dollars, which sum shall be separately held by said Board for the sole and exclusive use of permanent improvement, in the nature of black-top resurfacing of said Park Avenue and Roosevelt Avenue.

SECTION 10. That this ordinance shall take effect at the expiration of thirty (30) days from the date when a copy thereof shall have been filed in the office of the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; provided that if the Commission shall, prior to the expiration of such period, institute a proceeding under the provisions of Section 911 of the Public Utility Law affecting its validity, this ordinance shall become effective only upon approval by said Commission.

SECTION 11. That the said Company shall, under its seal and by its proper officers, within sixty (60) days from the date of the final enactment of this ordinance, signify in writing its acceptance of all the terms, conditions, regulations and restrictions herein contained, in default of which this ordinance shall become null and void and of no effect.

SECTION 12. That all legal advertising or printing fees incurred by the Township of Hopewell, in connection with the passage of this ordinance, shall be paid by the said Company.
