ORDINANCE NO. 57-5 ✓

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING HAWKING, PEDDLING, OR TRAVELING FROM PLACE TO PLACE WITH GOODS, WARES AND MERCHANDISE OR PRODUCE, AND SELLING OR OFFERING THE SAME FOR SALE, OR SOLICITING ORDERS FOR THE SALE OF THE SAME, WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, hereby enact and ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons whomsoever, excepting farmers selling produce raised by them; resident grocers; travelling salesmen selling goods to merchants only; persons selling goods, wares and merchandise, donated by the owners thereof, the proceeds whereof are to be applied to any charitable or philanthropic purpose; and any manufacturer or producer in the sale of bread and bakery products, meat and meat products or milk and milk products; to solicit orders for the sale of goods, wares or merchandise without first having obtained a license therefore.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Township to issue licenses to hawk, peddle, sell or offer for sale goods, wares and merchandise within the Township of Hopewell, or to solicit orders for the sale of goods, wares or merchandise within the Township of Hopewell, upon payment of the following fees:

For each solicitor, salesman or peddler travelling on foot \$5.00 for each day or fractional part thereof; \$15.00 for each week of six days; \$50.00 for each calendar month and \$200.00 for each year.

For each solicitor, peddler or salesman travelling in a vehicle of not more than one ton capacity, \$8.00 per each day or fractional part thereof; \$30.00 for each week of six days; \$50.00 for each calendar month and \$250.00 for each year.

For each solicitor, peddler or salesman travelling with a vehicle of more than one ton capacity, there shall be added to the license fee charged for a solicitor, peddler or salesman travelling with a vehicle of not more than one ton capacity, 10% for each additional ton or fraction thereof, for the time for which said license is applied for.

SECTION 3. Any person or persons whomsoever who shall within the limits of the said Township of Hopewell, hawk, peddle, sell or offer for sale or solicit orders for the sale of any goods, wares or merchandise without first having obtained the license provided for in Section 2 hereof, shall be subject, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace of said Township of Hopewell, to a fine of not more than \$100.00 together with costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of the fine and costs the person or persons so convicted shall be imprisoned in the Beaver County Jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

SECTION 4. In case any section or part of a section of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal or unconstitutional, the remaining sections, and parts thereof, shall be valid and not be affected thereby.

SECTION 5. All other ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed insofar as the same conflict herewith.

ENACTED AND ORDAINED into an Ordinance this 1st day of April, 1957.

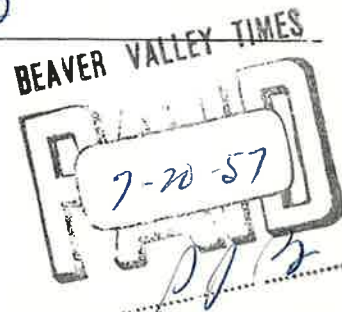
For each solicitor, salesman or peddler
