Prohibition of Accumulation
Of Garbage

ORDINANCE NO. 58-2

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROHIBITING THE ACCUMULATION OR DUMPING OF GARBAGE AND REFUSE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL AND THE ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC OR PRIVATE DUMPS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE SAID TOWNSHIP, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, under the authority of the Act of June 24, 1931, (P.L. 1206) and its amendments and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

Section 1. No person, association, firm, corporation, borough or township shall keep or suffer to remain upon his, her or its premises, or on any private property, any garbage, refuse, offal, carcass, putrid matter or other offensive or unwholesome matter, or ~~case~~ the same upon any lot or piece of ground within the said Township, or upon the shores or margin of any stream or body of water, or into any sewer inlet or upon any sidewalk in the said Township. Nor may any person, firm, corporation, borough or township use or permit to be used any spot or place within the said Township as a public or private dump for garbage, refuse or rubbish.

Section 2. Any person, firm, corporation, borough or township who or which shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and cost, to imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days. PROVIDED: each day's continuance of a violation shall constitute a separate offense.

ORDAINED AND ENACTED into an Ordinance this 13th day of January, 1958.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, under the authority of the Act of June 24, 1931, (P.L. 1206) and its amendments and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

Section 1. No person, association, firm, corporation, borough or township shall keep or suffer to remain upon his, her or its premises, or on any private property, any garbage, refuse, offal, carcass, putrid matter or other offensive or unwholesome matter or cause the same upon any lot or piece of ground within the said Township, or upon the shores or margin of any stream or body of water, or into any sewer inlet or upon any sidewalk in the said Township. Nor may any person, firm, corporation, borough or township use or permit to be used any spot or place within the said Township as a public or private dump for garbage, refuse or rubbish.

Section 2. Any person, firm, corporation, borough or township who or which shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and cost, to imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days. PROVIDED: each day's continuance of a violation shall constitute a separate offense.

ORDAINED AND ENACTED into an Ordinance this 13th day of January, 1958.
