ORDINANCE NO. 58-4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL,  
COUNTY OF BEAVER AND COMMONWEALTH OF  
PENNSYLVANIA, FIXING THE TAX RATE FOR THE  
YEAR 1958 AND APPROPRIATING SPECIFIC SUMS  
ESTIMATED TO BE REQUIRED FOR THE SPECIFIC  
PURPOSES OF THE TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENT,  
HEREINAFTER SET FORTH, DURING THE CURRENT  
FISCAL YEAR.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by  
the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell, County of Beaver,  
Pennsylvania:

SECTION 1. That a tax be and the same is hereby levied on all property  
within the said Township subject to taxation for Township purposes for the  
fiscal year 1958, as follows:

Tax rate for general Township purposes, the sum of thirteen and six-  
tenths (13.6) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of One  
Dollar and thirty-six cents (\$1.36) on each one hundred dollars of assessed  
valuation.

For debt purposes, the sum of one and four-tenths (1.4) mills on each  
dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of fourteen (14) cents on each one  
hundred dollars of assessed valuation.

SECTION 2. That for the expenses of the Township for the fiscal year  
1958 the following amounts are hereby appropriated from the revenues  
available for the current year for the specific purposes set forth below,  
which amounts are more fully itemized in the Budget Form - Schedule B:
