ORDINANCE NO. 60-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, COUNTY OF BEAVER AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, FIXING THE TAX RATE FOR THE YEAR 1960 AND APPROPRIATING SPECIFIC SUMS ESTIMATED TO BE REQUIRED FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSES OF THE TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENT, HEREINAFTER SET FORTH, DURING THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell, County of Beaver, Pennsylvania:

SECTION 1. That a tax be and the same is hereby levied on all property within the said Township subject to taxation for Township purposes for the fiscal year 1960, as follows:

Tax rate for general Township purposes, the sum of five and thirty-five hundredths (5.35) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of fifty-three and five-tenths cents (\$.535) on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.

For debt purposes, the sum of sixty-five hundredths of one mill (.65) on each dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of six and five-tenths (\$.065) cents on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.

SECTION 2. That the amounts appropriated from the revenues available for the current year for specific purposes are fully itemized in the Budget Form - Schedule B.

SECTION 3. An estimate of the specific items making up the amounts appropriated to the respective Departments is on file in the office of the Secretary of the Township, Clark Boulevard, Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania.

SECTION 4. That any ordinance, or part of ordinance, conflicting with this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this ordinance.

Tax rate for general Township purposes, the sum of five and thirty-five hundredths (5.35) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of fifty-three and five-tenths cents (5.353) on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.
For debt purposes, the sum of sixty-five hundredths of one mill (.65) on each dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of six and five-tenths (.665) cents on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.
SECTION 2. That the amounts appropriated from the revenues available for the current year for specific purposes are fully itemized in the Budget Form—Schedule B.
SECTION 3. An estimate of the specific items making up the amounts appropriated to the respective Departments is on file in the office of the Secretary of the Township, Clark Boulevard, Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania.
SECTION 4. That any ordinance, or part of ordinance, conflicting with this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this ordinance.
