GILMORE STREET beginning at its intersection with the northerly line of the Old Brodhead Road and extending northwardly for a distance of one thousand eighty-one (1081) feet more or less, to its intersection with the southerly line of the Coroapolis-Woodlawn Street Railway right of way, as will more fully appear in the Shannopin Heights Plan recorded in the Recorder's Office of Beaver County in Plan Book Vol. 2 pages 74 and 75 County in Plan Book Vol. 2, pages 74 and 75.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date provided by law.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent Section 3. with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.
