ORDINANCE NO. 60-4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, VACATING GILMORE STREET IN SHANNOPIN HEIGHTS PLAN IN SAID TOWNSHIP AS RECORDED IN PLAN BOOK VOL. 2, PAGES 74 and 75.

WHEREAS, after public hearing at the Hopewell Township Municipal Building, Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania on August 31, 1960, pursuant to notice required by Section 2007 of the First Class Township Law, the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township on September 13, 1960 filed its Report in the Court of Quarter Sessions of Beaver County, Pennsylvania at No. 1 August Sessions, 1960, approving the vacation of Gilmore Street, being an unopened street as set out in the Shannopin Heights Plan situate in said Township and recorded in the Recorder's Office of Beaver County in Plan Book Vol. 2, pages 74 and 75.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

Section 1. That the following street as set out in the Shannopin Heights Plan, situate in Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania and recorded in the Recorder's Office of Beaver County, in Plan Book Vol. 2, pages 74 and 75, be and the same is hereby vacated:

GILMORE STREET beginning at its intersection with the northerly line of the Old Brodhead Road and extending northwardly for a distance of one thousand eighty-one (1081) feet more or less, to its intersection with the southerly line of the Coropolis-Woodlawn Street Railway right of way, as will more fully appear in the Shannopin Heights Plan recorded in the Recorder's Office of Beaver County in Plan Book Vol. 2, pages 74 and 75.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date provided by law.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.
