An Ordinance Approving The First Supplemental Agreement Of Lease With Hopewell Township Authority And Directing the Proper Officers Of The Township To Enter Into And Consummate On Behalf Of The Township The Said First Supplemental Agreement of Lease.

WHEREAS, the Hopewell Township Authority has heretofore undertaken at the request of the Township of Hopewell the construction of a system of sanitary sewers and treatment plant, known as the "Initial Construction Project", to serve the residents of the Township of Hopewell and for such purpose has issued its Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series A, in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,960,000; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide funds to pay the cost of completing its Initial Construction Project, it is necessary for the Authority to issue its Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series B, in the aggregate principal amount of \$125,000;

WHEREAS, in order for the Authority to issue additional bonds, it is necessary for the Township to enter into a supplemental agreement of lease with the Authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Township of Hopewell, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by and with the authority of the same:

Section 1. The Township of Hopewell shall enter into a supplemental agreement of lease with Hopewell Township Authority, being the first supplement to the Agreement of Lease, dated as of May 1, 1958, substantially in the form of the First Supplemental Agreement of Lease, to be dated as of May 1, 1961, which is hereby made a part hereof by reference only and is on file with the Secretary of the Township.

Section 2. The President of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to execute on behalf of the Township, the First Supplemental Agreement of Lease substantially in the form of the said First Supplemental Agreement of Lease, which Supplemental Agreement when consummated shall be attested to by the Secretary.
