### ORDINANCE NO. 61-9

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, TAKING OVER AND ADOPTING CERTAIN STREETS AND ROADS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL AS PUBLIC STREETS OR ROADS.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

Section 1. The following streets and roads in Meadow Wood Plan No. 3, Section 2; Plan No. 4 and Plan No. 4-Revision, as recorded in the Recorder's Office of Beaver County in Plan Book Vol. 8, pages 4 and 5; Vol. 8, pages 96 and 97; Vol. 8, pages 134 and 135, are hereby taken over and adopted as public streets or roads in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania:

- (a) Montpelier Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Concord Drive to Rhode Island Street, a distance of approximately .08 of a mile;
- (b) Hartford Drive, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Montpelier Street to Rhode Island Street, a distance of approximately .12 of a mile;
- (c) Rhode Island Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Maratta Road to Maine Avenue, a distance of approximately .59 of a mile;
- (d) Collins Avenue, having a 50 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Maratta Road to Alden Street, a distance of approximately .12 of a mile;
- (e) Croxall Avenue, having a 50 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Alden Street to Columbus Drive, a distance of approximately .22 of a mile;
- (f) Columbus Drive, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Cabot Street (formerly Chestnut Street) to its end at cul-de-sac, a distance of approximately .19 of a mile;
- (g) Cabot Street (formerly Chestnut Street), having a 50 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Croxall Avenue to Columbus Drive, a distance of approximately .06 of a mile.

Section 2. The following streets and roads in Clearview Estates Plan No. 1; Plan No. 2; Plan No. 3, Blocks A,B and C; Plan No. 2-Revision; Plan No. 3, Blocks H and I; Plan No. 3, Block D; Plan No. 3, Blocks E,F,G and Pt. of D, as recorded in the Recorder's Office of Beaver County in Plan Book Vol. 7, pages 174 and 175; Vol. 8, page 68; Vol. 8, pages 156 and 157; Vol. 8, page 168; Vol. 9, pages 24 and 25; Vol. 9, page 26, are hereby taken over and adopted as public streets or roads in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania:

(a) Busman Avenue, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Webb Street to Clearview Avenue, a distance of approximately .17 of a mile;

- (b) Clearview Avenue, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Webb Street to its end, a distance of approximately .18 of a mile;
- (c) Clifton Drive, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Clearview Avenue to McIntosh Drive, a distance of approximately .33 of a mile;
- (d) McIntosh Drive, having a 50 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Route 151 to Martin Street, a distance of approximately .22 of a mile;
- (e) McIntosh Drive, having a 50 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Goodnow Street to Schell Street, a distance of approximately .14 of a mile;
- (f) Webb Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Clifton Drive to its end, a distance of approximately .50 of a mile;
- (g) Goodnow Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Martin Street to its end, a distance of approximately .06 of a mile;
- (h) Martin Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Webb Street to its end, a distance of approximately .25 of a mile;
- (i) Alan Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Webb Street to dead end, a distance of approximately .27 of a mile;
- (j) Maple Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from entrance of Wickham Village to McIntosh Drive, a distance of approximately .16 of a mile.
- Section 3. The following street or road is hereby taken over and adopted as a public street or road in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania:
- (a) Covert Street, having a 40 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Maratta Road to its end, a distance of approximately .31 of a mile.
- Section 4. The following streets and roads in Sheffield Heights Plan No. 1, as recorded in the Recorder's Office of Beaver County in Plan Book Vol. 8, pages 130, 131 and 132, are hereby taken over and adopted as public streets or roads in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania:
- (a) Imperial Drive, having a 50 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Chapel Road to Royal Drive, a distance of approximately .18 of a mile

(b) Fairlane Drive, having a 50 foot right-of-way, at existing grades, from Imperial Drive to Grand Avenue, a distance of approximately .27 of a mile.
