ORDINANCE NO. 62-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 56-7 OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES FOR GENERAL TOWNSHIP PURPOSES UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE ACT OF JUNE 25, 1947, (PAMPHLET LAWS 1145) AND ITS AMENDMENTS, UPON THE PRIVILEGE OF USING, MAINTAINING, OPERATING AND POSSESSING BILLBOARDS, MECHANICAL AMUSEMENT DEVICES AND JUKE BOXES, AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF SUCH TAXES AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same, that Ordinance No. 56-7 is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. That Section 2 of said Ordinance dealing with the taxation of billboards is hereby repealed.

Section 2. That Section 3 of said Ordinance which reads as follows:

"A tax is hereby imposed on each juke box or mechanical amusement device possessed, operated or maintained in the Township of Hopewell. Such tax shall be payable by the person owning or operating the establishment in which such device is installed for use. Such tax shall be payable at the following rate: on each mechanical amusement device, \$75.00 for the calendar year 1956 or any portion thereof; on each juke box, \$25.00 for the calendar year 1956 or any portion thereof." shall be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. A tax is hereby imposed on each juke box or mechanical amusement device possessed, operated or maintained in the Township of Hopewell. Such tax shall be payable by the person owning or operating the establishment in which such device is installed for use. Such tax shall be due and payable on February 1st of each calendar year at the following rate: on each mechanical amusement device, \$75.00 for the calendar year; on each juke box, \$25.00 for the calendar year. However, should any such device aforesaid be possessed, operated or maintained in the Township of Hopewell after July 1st of any calendar year, then in such event the tax imposed thereon shall be due and payable within thirty (30) days at the following rate: on each mechanical amusement device, \$37.50 for the remainder of the calendar year; on each juke box, \$12.50 for the remainder of the calendar year.

Section 3. That Section 6 of said Ordinance which reads as follows:

"No deduction or refund of any tax payable under Sections 2 and 3 of this ordinance shall be granted in case of any taxable payable for less than a full calendar year, or in case of any device destroyed, stolen, sold or otherwise disposed of or transferred after the payment of such tax." shall be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 6. No deduction or refund of any tax payable under Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be granted in case of any device destroyed, stolen, sold or otherwise disposed of or transferred after the payment of such tax.

Section 4. That all ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

ENACTED AND ORDAINED into an Ordinance this 12th day of March, 1962.
