ORDINANCE NO. 62-4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA REGULATING THE SPEED OF VEHICLES ON THE STREETS, ROADS AND ALLEYS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

Section 1. Definitions and Interpretations. Words and phrases, when used in this Ordinance, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, as now in force, or as hereafter amended, enacted or reenacted. The singular shall include the plural and the masculine shall include the feminine.

Section 2. Regulation of Speed. No person shall operate a motor vehicle in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania at a speed in excess of twenty miles per hour (20 M.P.H.) along any right of way, street, road or alley taken over, adopted and maintained by the Township of Hopewell as a public street, excepting Maratta Road and State Highways in said Township.

Section 3. Enforcement. Such established speed regulations shall be indicated by the erection of official signs, spaced at intervals not less than one-eighth (1/8) of a mile apart in said areas. All signs shall be on the right hand side of the road facing the traffic being regulated and on the left hand side facing regulated traffic on one-way roads.

Section 4. Penalties. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon summary conviction before a Justice of the Peace, be sentenced to pay a fine of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and costs of prosecution for each such violation and, in default of payment thereof, shall undergo imprisonment for not more than five (5) days for each violation.

Section 5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.
