ORDINANCE NO. 64-8

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 60-2, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROVIDING FOR SEWAGE DISPOSAL, SETTING FORTH SPECIFICATIONS, TABLES, TESTS, RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF SEPTIC TANKS AND SEPTIC TANK SYSTEMS, PROVIDING FOR FEES AND IMPOSING PENALTIES." BY ADDING SECTION 7a, b, c, d and e PROVIDING FOR BASEMENT SEWER LINE SPECIFICATIONS, INSTALLATION REQUIREMENTS AND INSPECTION.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 60-2 be and the same is hereby amended by adding the following provisions:

"SECTION 7a. That all sewer pipe necessary under footer, basement and foundation shall be of extra heavy four (4) inch cast iron soil pipe. (Note: Terra Cotta Pipe may be used.)

b. That a clean out plug shall be installed (inside the house) as close to the outer wall of all buildings as physically possible on every installation.

c. That the fall of all sewer installations shall be no less than one fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an inch to the foot.

d. That no installation shall contain sewer pipe with a curve exceeding forty-five (45) degrees.

e. All sewer installations shall be inspected by the Township Engineer or his agent before they are covered."

ENACTED AND ORDAINED into an Ordinance this 9th day of November, 1964.
