ORDINANCE NO. 66-8

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROHIBITING ABANDONMENT, KEEPING OR PARKING OF WRECKED, NON-OPERATING OR DISCARDED VEHICLES ON ANY STREET, HIGHWAY, AVENUE, ALLEY, WAY, DRIVE OR OTHER PUBLIC PROPERTY AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, vehicles are or may in the future be abandoned in the streets and other places within the Township; and

WHEREAS, there are or may in the future be dismantled, partially dismantled, wrecked, junked, non-operating or discarded vehicles left about the Township other than in junk yards or other appropriate places; and

WHEREAS, such conditions tend to impede traffic in the streets or interfere with the enjoyment of and reduce the value of private property; invite plundering; create fire hazards to children as well as adults; interfere with the comfort and well-being of the public and create, extend and aggravate urban blight; and

WHEREAS, adequate protection of the public health, safety and general welfare requires that such conditions be regulated, abated or prohibited;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

SECTION 1. Definitions.

a. "Person" shall mean any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company or organization of any kind.

b. "Vehicle" shall mean a machine propelled by power other than human power designed to travel along the ground by use of wheels, treads, runners or slides and transport persons or property or pull machinery and shall include, without limitation, automobile, truck, trailer, motorcycle, tractor, buggy and wagon.

c. "Street or highway" shall mean the entire width between the boundary lines of every way publicly maintained or when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.

d. "Abandoned vehicle" shall mean any vehicle which is disabled and left on any street or public thoroughfare or highway of the Township without a current registration plate or current inspection sticker or such circumstances as to cause said vehicle reasonably to appear to have been abandoned; or any such vehicle which is parked in such a manner as to block a driveway, intersection fire hydrant or in any other manner present a definite hazard or obstruction to the movement of traffic; or any vehicle which is illegally parked.

SECTION 2. Abandonment of Vehicles.

No person shall abandon any vehicle within the Township and no person shall leave any vehicle at any place within the Township for such time and under such circumstances as to cause such vehicle reasonably to appear to have been abandoned.

SECTION 3. Leaving Wrecked Non-Operating Vehicle on Street.

No person shall leave any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked or junked vehicle on any public street, ~~road~~, alley, way or highway within the Township of Hopewell.

SECTION 4. Penalties.

Any person violating any provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars and costs, or be imprisoned in the Beaver County Jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days or be both so fined and imprisoned. Each day such violation is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as such hereunder.

SECTION 5.

All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, such conditions tend to impose a burden on the community, and it is the policy of the Township to impose a fine of thirty (30) days or interfere with the operation of the Township, and each day such violation is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as such hereunder.

SECTION 5.
All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
