ORDINANCE NO. 73-/

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ESTABLISHING THE COMPENSATION TO BE PAID TO THE TREASURER OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL FOR THOSE DUTIES IMPOSED UPON HIM BY LAW AND THOSE ADDITIONAL DUTIES HEREIN PRESCRIBED.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, a municipal corporation under The First Class Township Code situate in the County of Beaver and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED:

SECTION 1. That the Treasurer shall receive as compensation for his duties as Treasurer of the Township of Hopewell a sum equal to one per centum (1%) of all moneys received or collected by him for the Township of Hopewell.

SECTION 2. That the Treasurer shall receive as compensation for his duties as tax collector for the Township of Hopewell a sum equal to two per centum (2%) of all taxes and special assessments received or collected by him for the Township of Hopewell. "Taxes" as used herein shall mean and shall be construed to be all taxes, other than taxes levied and assessed under the authority of The Local Tax Enabling Act (Act of December 31, 1965 P.L. 1257), as amended, which the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell may lawfully levy including without limitation, taxes on real estate, occupations and professions under the authority of the Act of May 22, 1933, P.L. 853, Article II, as amended, interim assessment of real estate and taxes returned under the Act of May 29, 1931, P.L. 280, commonly known as the County Return Act. "Special assessments" as used herein shall mean and be construed to be all assessments, rentals or charges

which the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell may lawfully impose including, without limitation, street lighting and fire hydrant assessments.

SECTION 3. That the Treasurer shall receive as compensation for his duties as collector of per capita taxes levied under the authority of The Local Tax Enabling Act, as amended, a sum equal to two per centum (2%) of per capita taxes received or collected by him for the Township of Hopewell.

SECTION 4. That the total annual compensation to be paid to the Treasurer of the Township of Hopewell for his duties as treasurer, his duties as tax collector as defined in Section 2 hereof, and for his duties as collector of per capita taxes levied under the authority of The Local Tax Enabling Act, as amended, shall be limited to and shall not exceed the sum of \$\frac{4500.69}{500.69}\$.

shall be paid periodically to the Treasurer following his deposit to the Township account of all moneys received or collected by him and his monthly report made at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell. Provided, however, that such periodic payments shall not exceed the sum of \$ 3500 ° ; the balance of the compensation due the Treasurer, which shall not exceed the sum of \$ /000.00 , shall be paid after annual exoneration and audit of the Treasurer's accounts and certification by the Treasurer of compliance with the following Acts of Assembly: The Act of July 2, 1937, P.L. 2797, as amended, Section 20 of The Local Tax Collection Law and Sections 19 and 20 of The Local Tax Enabling Act.

SECTION 6. All ordinances and resolutions inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective on January 1, 1974.
