AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROVIDING FOR THE AUDIT OF ITS ACCOUNTS BY AN INDEPENDENT AUDITOR AND ABOLISHING THE OFFICE OF ELECTED AUDITOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell, a municipal corporation under the First Class Township Code, situate in the County of Beaver and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED:

- 1. That pursuant to the authority contained in Section 520 of the First Class Township Code (53 P.S. Section 55520) as amended, the audit of its accounts shall be made by an independent auditor whose qualifications shall be and appointment made in accordance with said statute and provisions hereunder.
- 2. The said independent auditor shall be a certified public accountant, registered in Pennsylvania, a firm of certified public accountants so registered, or a competent public accountant or a competent firm of public accountants.
- 3. The said independent auditor shall be appointed annually by resolution of the Board of Commissioners at least thirty (30) days prior to the close of the fiscal year.
- 4. The said independent auditor shall make an independent examination of all the accounts and accounting records of the Township for the fiscal year then closing.
- 5. The said independent auditor shall have and possess all the powers and perform all the duties provided in the First Class Township Code for elected auditors.
- 6. The compensation for said appointed independent auditor shall be fixed by the Board of Commissioners.

- 7. The Office of elected auditor in the Township of Hopewell is hereby abolished.
- 8. Any ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
