

Ordinance 77-5

Dogs (Barking)

12/8/1977

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL,
BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REQUIRING OWNERS
OR PERSONS IN CONTROL OF DOGS TO CONTROL SAID
DOGS IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PREVENT THE DOG
FROM BARKING SO AS TO DISTURB THE PEACE AND QUIET
OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD: PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR
VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Commissioners of
the Township of Hopewell, a Municipal Corporation under the First
Class Township Code situate in the County of Beaver and the
Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND

ENACTED:

1. That pursuant to the authority contained in the First
Class Township Code the repeated barking by dogs so as to disturb
the peace and quiet of a neighborhood within the Township of
Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, is hereby declared to be
a public nuisance and to be detrimental to the public health
and welfare.
2. It shall be unlawful for any owner or person in control
of a dog within the corporate limits of the Township of Hopewell
to permit said dog to repeatedly bark so as to disturb the peace
and quiet of the neighborhood.
3. That if any owner or person in control of a dog upon
receiving Written Notice from the Zoning Officer or Secretary or
other duly authorized agent of the Township of Hopewell that
their dog is disturbing the peace and quiet of the neighborhood
by repeatedly barking and fails to stop said disturbance within
twenty-four (24) hours after having received said notice, then
said owner or person in control is in violation of this Ordinance.
4. Any owner or person in control of a dog upon conviction
of the violation of this Ordinance before a Justice of the Peace,

shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than TWENTY-FIVE (\$25.00) DOLLARS and costs of prosecution and in default of payment of such fine and costs to be imprisoned in the Beaver County Jail for not more than Three (3) days.

a public nuisance and to be detrimental to the public health
and welfare.
2. It shall be unlawful for any owner or person in control
of a dog within the corporate limits of the Township of Hopewell
to permit said dog to repeatedly bark so as to disturb the peace
and quiet of the neighborhood.
3. That if any owner or person in control of a dog upon
receiving Written Notice from the Zoning Officer or Secretary or
other duly authorized agent of the Township of Hopewell that
their dog is disturbing the peace and quiet of the neighborhood
by repeatedly barking and fails to stop said disturbance within
twenty-four (24) hours after having received said notice, then
said owner or person in control is in violation of this Ordinance.
4. Any owner or person in control of a dog upon conviction
of the violation of this Ordinance before a Justice of the Peace,

shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than TWENTY-FIVE (\$25.00) DOLLARS and costs of prosecution and in default of payment of such fine and costs to be imprisoned in the Beaver County Jail for not more than Three (3) days.
