ORDINANCE NO. 80-4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL,  
BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROVIDING  
FOR THE MANDATORY RETIREMENT OF MEMBERS  
OF THE HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPART-  
MENT UPON THE ATTAINMENT OF THE AGE OF  
SIXTY-FIVE (65) YEARS.

WHEREAS, age is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably  
necessary to the efficient operation of the police department; and

WHEREAS, physical ability generally declines with age; and

WHEREAS, members of the police force must exhibit a high condition  
of physical fitness to protect the public and to carry out its many duties  
inherent in the position of police officer; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of the expedient enforcement of our  
criminal laws and the efficient administration of our criminal justice  
system, which enforcement and administration necessarily requiring that  
the police force be and remain in a high state of physical conditioning  
to carry out the many and varied physical commitments of employment as a  
police officer; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is reasonably necessary for the proper  
regulation and administration of the pension ~~plan~~ and retirement funds;  
and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance will serve to reasonably enhance the  
actuarial soundness of the retirement fund.

BE IT ENACTED and ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell  
Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, it is hereby enacted and ordained by  
authority of the same;

DEFINITIONS

Section 1. The following words, when used in this Ordinance, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except in those instances where the context clearly indicates otherwise:

A. The words "member (s) of the police force" shall mean any person employed in the capacity of a police officer by the Township of Hopewell, regardless of position held and shall include all police officers whether employed full or part-time, and shall include all police officers whether or not they are governed by the Rules and Regulations of the Civil Service Commission as established in the Township.

B. The words, "sixty-five years of age" shall mean the date when a member of the police force becomes sixty-five (65) years of age, regardless of whether the age of sixty-five years is attained prior to, or subsequent to the enactment of this Ordinance.

EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 2. This Ordinance shall become effective on January 31, 1980.

SHORT TITLE

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Police Retirement Ordinance of the Township of Hopewell."

DECLARATION OF MANDATORY RETIREMENT

Section 4. Every member of the Township police force shall be retired from employment on the first day of the month following the member's sixty-fifth birthday.


