ORDINANCE NO. 80-6

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL IN CONNECTION WITH HOPEWELL COMMUNITY PARK, RELATING TO THE MANAGEMENT THEREOF, PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF PERSONS WHILE IN SUCH PARK, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATIONS OF SUCH REGULATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hopewell, a municipal corporation under the First Class Township Code situate in Beaver County, Pennsylvania, AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED:

SECTION 1.

The tract of land, located off Laird Avenue and owned by the Township of Hopewell, having been established as a public park of the Township and designated "Hopewell Community Park".

SECTION 2.

The following rules and regulations are hereby established for the management and protection of Hopewell Community Park, hereinafter designated "the park".

(a) The park shall be open daily to the public between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M. all activities in the park shall cease and all persons in the park shall leave as soon as possible thereafter. No person, other than authorized employees thereof, shall be in the park at any time between 11:00 P.M. and 8:00 A.M. on the following morning, except as from time to time may be established by Resolution, which Resolution shall be an enforceable part of this Ordinance.

(b) No person shall remove any bench, seat or table from the park or change the location thereof without permission from the Township.

(c) No person shall injure, deface, remove, cut or damage any of the trees, plants, shrubs, turf, buildings, structures or fixtures therein, or any other property of the Township located within the park.

(d) No person shall conduct himself within the park so as to annoy any other person using the park for recreational purposes.

(e) No person shall hold any meeting or gathering, assembled through advertisement or public notice, or any gathering otherwise assembled and composed of ten (10) or more persons, within the limits of the park, without having first made application to the Township thereof for a permit therefor. Such permit shall indicate the park locations in the park where such gathering or meeting shall be held, and such gathering shall not be held at any other park location within the park, said park locations shall be established by Resolution. The application for such permit shall be in the name of a person who shall be responsible for seeing that all refuse left by the group shall be placed in proper containers before leaving the park. Each permit will require a deposit and rental fee for any shelter or facility used by the group. Said rental fee shall be established from time to time by Resolution.

(f) No person shall set up any booth, table or stand for the sale of any article whatsoever within the limits of the park, without the written consent of the Township, which shall have authority to refuse such consent in any instance.

(g) No person shall dispose of any litter, waste, or garbage in the park. All persons using the park shall dispose of all waste and garbage left by them in such proper receptacles.

(h) No person shall injure, deface or destroy any notice, rule

or regulation posted at any place within the park by authority of the Township. Nor shall any person post, at any place within the park any notice or placard other than by authority of the Township.

(i) No person shall set or maintain any fire in the park except in stoves and fireplaces maintained for the purpose and located by authority of the Township. As hereinafter set forth, only charcoal and/or wooden fires are permitted. In the event a wooden fire is instituted, any wood so utilized shall be brought from outside the park.

(j) No person shall bring any spirituous liquor into the park, either for his own use or for the use of any other person, except upon application to the Township, said application shall be in the name of a person who shall be responsible for seeing that no such spirituous liquor is made available to any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years, as is provided by law. There must be more food than liquor present. Exclusive use of alcohol is not permitted in the park.

(k) No person, other than an officer of the law, shall carry any firearm within the limits of the park. Likewise, no person shall engage in archery sports, not engage in any other functions involving force propelled devices unless first approved by the Township.

(l) No person shall operate or cause to have in his possession any unlicensed motor vehicle and/or cycle.

(m) No person shall bring unrestrained pets into the park.

(n) There shall be no swimming, ice skating and/or boating in the park lake unless the same is authorized pursuant to Township permit.

(o) There shall be no parking and/or driving in areas other than those designated parking areas or on paved roadways.

(p) The speed limit within the territorial confines of the Park

shall be 5 (Five) miles per hour as indicated by the posting of signs stating such fact.

(q) No person shall climb any tree, sit, stand, or walk on any park sign, park structure, or park building not customarily utilized for such purposes.

(r) No person shall erect tents, shacks, shelters, trailers, or any other structure for overnight camping or otherwise without express Township approval.

(s) No person shall post, draw, tack or otherwise cause any sign to be in existence without Township approval.

(t) No open fires are permitted in the park; Fires are only permitted after due consideration for the health, safety, and welfare of the persons and property within the park, in any event, however, only charcoal and/or wooden fires are permitted.

(v) No remote control and/or hobby devices are permitted to be operated within the confines of the park unless approval is obtained from the Township.

SECTION 3.

Any person who shall violate any of the rules and regulations contained in the second section of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution for each and every offense. Provided: each day's violation of any of the provisions of such action shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 4.

The person of "Park Director" , "Assistant Park Director" or "Park Attendant" shall generally be charged with the enforcement of the

Ordinance.

SECTION 5.

All permits required by the provisions of this Ordinance shall be required to be posted within the confines of the park at locations to be determined by the Park Director.
