A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL,
BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, DESIGNATING
JANUARY 20, 1992 AS MARTIN LUTHER KING,
JR. DAY IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL; IN
RECOGNITION OF DR. KING'S LEADERSHIP AND
DEDICATION TO HUMAN RIGHTS.

BY RESOLUTION OF
THE HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS Martin Luther King, Jr., Minister, Theologian,
Civil Rights Activist, Author, and Philosopher, was born
January 15th in the year of our Lord 1929; and

WHEREAS through his leadership, Dr. King stirred the
social conscience of his community and nation; and

WHEREAS Dr. King extended his moral crusade against
racial segregation in the South, to fight social injustice
everywhere; and

WHEREAS Dr. King worked to achieve these reforms through
the use of passive resistance and nonviolent demonstration;
and

WHEREAS his efforts and achievements towards equality
and freedom for all mankind resulted in national and
international acclaim; and

WHEREAS the United States Government and the
Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have established the third
Monday of January as "Martin Luther King Day".

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED January 20, 1992 shall be
"Martin Luther King Day" in the Township of Hopewell, in
recognition of his tireless efforts for social justice and
the harmony of mankind.
