## RESOLUTION NO. 54-111

WHEREAS, the samitary disposal of garbage has become, or threatens to become, a najor problem for this municipality and for other municipalities of Beaver County, and

WHERHAS, in view of the population density of Beaver County there appears to be no readily feasible or practical method of disposal of garbage in this county area by individual municipalities, other than incineration, and

WHEREAS, this community does not itself have to dispose of garbage of a quantity sufficient to justify the expense of the construction of an incinerator solely for the use of this municipality. As a result, the construction of an incinerator solely for the use of this municipality would be economically wasteful unless the use of the incinerator, up to its capacity, could be rented by other municipalities. However, such rental by other municipalities could not be guaranteed or even predicated, with reasonable certainty, over any substantial length of time, and

WHEREAS, we understand that other communities in the County are faced with the same problem and are secking a study by the Beaver County Planning and Zoning Commission in the belief that the most economical and practical solution of this problem of garbage disposal would be on a county-wide or multi-community basis, whether by incineration or any other method.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESCEVED that the Board of Commissioners of Hopewell Township, by this resolution, petition the Beaver County Planning and Zoning Commission to undertake a survey for the purpose of determining the feasibility of garbage disposal, by incineration or otherwise, on a county-wide or mulit-community basis.
