

RESOLUTION NO. 67-102

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Township of Hopewell purchase from Hill Land Company of Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, a parcel or tract of land, for the use of said Township, containing 99.48 acres situate in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, for the consideration of the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars.

Section 2. The President of the Board of Commissioners and the Township Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to pay, in consideration thereof, the said sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars to said Hill Land Company as follows: One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars upon delivery of the deed and to then execute and deliver to said Hill Land Company a Certificate of Indebtedness for the balance in the following form:

CERTIFICATE OF INDEBTEDNESS IN THE SUM OF \$4,000.00

The Township of Hopewell acknowledges that it has acquired by deed of conveyance from Hill Land Company of Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, a parcel or tract of land, for the use of said Township, containing 99.48 acres, situate in the Township of Hopewell, Beaver County, Pennsylvania.

In consideration whereof, the Township of Hopewell has paid the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars to said Hill Land Co. upon delivery of said deed and here now promises to pay the sum of Four Thousand (\$4,000.00) Dollars, representing the balance of the purchase price, with interest at the rate of Four (4%) per cent per annum on the unpaid balance, without default, payable on the following dates:

May 1, 1968 -	\$1,000.00
May 1, 1969 -	1,000.00
May 1, 1970 -	1,000.00
May 1, 1971 -	1,000.00

The said Township covenants and agrees with the said Hill Land Company its successors and assigns, that this Certificate of Indebtedness is issued by virtue of a resolution of the Township enacted and entered upon its minute book this 8th day of May, 1967; that said indebtedness is incurred in conformity with law and the Statutes of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania regulating indebtedness of townships.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Township of Hopewell has caused its corporate seal to be affixed and has caused these presents to be signed by its President of the Board of Commissioners and to be attested by its Secretary this 8th day of May, 1967.
