

RESOLUTION NO. 68-101

WHEREAS, there are not sufficient monies in the General Fund with which to pay the necessary costs of government which are due in January, 1968, and

WHEREAS, revenues for 1968 will not be available in time and amount to meet the current obligations which will be presented during such period:

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania borrow the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars from the Western Pennsylvania National Bank of Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, in anticipation of the receipt of taxes which will be levied for the year 1968, and other current revenues which will be collectible during the year 1968, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a Certificate of Indebtedness payable six (6) months from the date of the same be executed and delivered to the Western Pennsylvania National Bank, Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, in the amount of Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars, at the time of negotiation of said loan, and Michael Volitich, President and Charlotte M. Buffington, Secretary of the Hopewell Township Board of Commissioners, are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Certificate of Indebtedness in the following form on behalf of the Township of Hopewell.
