

RESOLUTION NO. 76-105

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOPEWELL, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, COMMENDING THE WOMEN'S CIVIC CLUB OF HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP.
